



<p>BREASTFEEDING INFORMATION</p> 	<p>BREASTFEEDING MANAGEMENT CLINIC Provides a comprehensive approach to breastfeeding challenges for the baby and family. They support any mother and baby having challenges (e.g., low milk, sore nipples) with breastfeeding from birth through older children (e.g., weaning). They accept self-referrals, as well as referrals from community providers. <p>CHILD DEVELOPMENT</p>  <p>Preemies develop differently than babies born at term. They may need a little extra help from their parents. When you know what your baby's development, you know how best support your baby and your baby's development</p>	<p>CDC CHILD DEVELOPMENT MILESTONE APP Skills such as taking the first step, smiling for the first time, and waving "bye-bye" are called developmental milestones. As the parent completes the questions, they are provided with information about typical eating for their child's age, including adjusted age. <p>EARLY INTERVENTION COLORADO Statewide program provides early intervention developmental education for families and services to children birth to 3 years of age who meet specific eligibility criteria. Family members, health care providers, and other community members can make a referral on behalf of a child.
